biennial award co-organized by nine building and construction related professional bodies. namely. The Hong Kong Construction Association (HKCA), The Hong Kong Institute of Architects (HKIA). The Hong Kong Institute of Construction Managers (HKICM), The Hong Kong Institution of Engineers (HKIE), The Hong Kong Institute of Housing (HKIH), The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors (HKIS), The Hong Kong Chapter of International Facility Management Association (IFMA - HK Chapter), The Hong Kong Quality Assurance Agency (HKQAA), and The Real Estate Developers Association of Hong Kong (REDA).

In this light, the members of these organizations also reflect the spirit of teamwork among them. Each time, the organizing committee rotates to an alternate chair. This year, it goes to the HKICM.

Regarding the jury panel, there is a newly added overseas juror this year - Professor Richard Frewer. The additional juror further enhances the impartiality of the Award. Besides, the OBA has been continuously refining its assessment criteria to reflect the rising aspirations over time. For example, the need to harmonize with the surrounding environment would be a vital consideration in the sub-category of Heritage. While refining the assessment criteria, the categories of award has also evolved over time.

On top of the usual Non-Residential and Residential main categories, this year's QBA welcomes a new sub-category under the Special Award Category along with Heritage, Innovation, Sustainability and Projects Outside Hong Kong, which further strengthens this year's

theme - Set No Boundary for Quality Buildings. One notable example is the National Swimming Center in Beijing According to Professor Mok, the purpose of

the addition of this sub-category is to recognize the overseas projects conducted by, or contributed to, any of the nine institutes or associations. in an attempt to promote the concept behind the OBA worldwide and to spreading the spirit of teamwork outside Hong Kong.

Mr. Cheung Hau Wai, JP, Director of Buildings, who is also the Head of this year's jury panel, revealed that the number of entries had doubled, compared to the last OBA in 2006.

He was delighted to add that not only the quantity had increased, the quality of the entries was remarkable too. Therefore, the jury panel had a very challenging job in the adjudication

Commenting on the performance of this year's entries, Mr Cheung spoke with high compliments about the outstanding performance of all nominations. "In each category, we have received many commendable entries that are very innovative and unique in their response to the design brief, the site characteristics and the environment. Take for instance the new subcategory on Sustainability, the entries have each demonstrated in their special ways how the building could harmonize with nature."

"As for the sub-category on Heritage, the entries have not only conserved the historical values and the architectural features of the original buildings; but they have also boosted the economic life of these buildings. A desolate building, regenerated through adaptive reuse.

could become an exhibition hall or a restaurant. They are now useful to the society, while generating income for the owners at the same time," Mr Cheung continued.

"Other exciting projects include those which further promote Hong Kong as an international business center; revitalize Central as a vibrant commercial district; invigorate our entertainment industry by developing suitable venues where people can spend an entire day, or attract overseas scientific experts to visit and live in our city for research and conferences."

Out of the total 39 entries, Professor Mok recognizes the impressive quality and hard work behind each nomination, including drawings, photos, text and data. This inspires the committee to publish a commemorative edition, recording the cream of each of the 19 finalists'

The QBA identifies all aspects of building construction, but commenting on the rather uninteresting exterior design of Hong Kong architecture, Professor Mok empathized, "The limited space in Hong Kong has greatly restricted the freedom of architects in designing some very innovative and conspicuous buildings. Our architects in Hong Kong are all very talented. It is simply the constraint of our geographical features that confines them in a certain way. After all, Hong Kong is all about practicality and usable space, and our architects have done a great

Ever since the launch of the QBA in 2001, it has received full support from the government. Over the years, it has evolved to become a widely recognized award among different building and constructing industries. Every two years, the QBA receives nominations from both previous and new participants, which again attests the growing success of this meaningful
